*Traces of Ink* explores the material and textual aspects of inks in Babylonian, Graeco-Roman, Syriac and Arabo-Islamic cultures from the interdisciplinary perspective that emerges from cooperation between philologists and natural scientists. Taking into account all branches of science, Bernd Roling illustrates in detail Rudbeck's majestic impact on antiquarianism, national mythology, and also on religious sciences and linguistics, but also documents the massive criticism the scholar from Uppsala received almost immediately.
