
It examines the fundamental features of liability and how it might evolve from addressing human intelligence to addressing artificial intelligence; explores technical features that may aid regulation;






#### Life and Death in Private Law

Life and death are the beginning and end of the legal person: the instigator and terminator of rights, interests, and obligations. They are also the nominal separator of particular fields of law (medical law from succession law, for example). As such they act as fault lines that can test the limit of private law principles and norms. This book explores what life and death tells us about private law and what private law can tell us about the meaning and value of life and death.

#### Duncan Sheehan


This ambitious book grapples with ongoing debates on the structure of unjust enrichment.

It argues that while unjust enrichment has the function of reversing defective enrichments, there is scope for normative pluralism in how the law achieves this.

Drawing on comparative material from Germany, Scotland and South Africa the book argues for a legal framework which combines elements of the absence of basis and unjust factors approaches. It assesses how that structure can be mapped against the causes of action that make up unjust enrichment, and concludes with a treatment of defences.


#### Subrogation and Marshalling

This innovative book studies how subrogation and marshalling should be understood in the context of private law. Subrogation and marshalling are legal rules allowing a person to rely on another's rights against third parties. There is little examination of why the law allows this reliance. This book argues that the key to understanding subrogation is the distinctive form of the rights that it creates. The form of rights reflects a particular role in ensuring interpersonal justice: subrogation's role is to properly distribute the burden of debts. Taking this model, the book resolves persistent controversies in the case law.

#### Insurability of Emerging Risks


Law, Theory and Practice Edited by Baris Soyer and Özlem Gürses

Despite the increasing prevalence of statistical evidence in modern litigation, how such evidence should be admitted and used by courts is often inconsistent and widely criticised. Accepting that statistical evidence can lead to more accurate decisions, the book identifies those criteria that allow courts to decide that statistical evidence is good for fact-finding.

The book contextualises the debate in the language and practice of evidence law, focusing on Australia and the UK, and drawing on examples from other common law countries such as Canada and the USA.
